Plant it...and they will come!

There are dozens of native herbaceous annuals and perennials that provide seeds for birds – some of the most conspicuous include Rudbeckia, Solidago, aster, and Eupatorium along with many others that are less conspicuous. The tiny seeds of many plants are found by our native songbirds with adept ability. This list contains trees because they also offer cover and nesting resources to birds, but a variety of native plants in the landscape ultimately offers the most to many different species of birds
