

Fall Beckons

September's lengthening shadows send signals to us—and to birds—that summer's end is near and that fall migration is underway. On a recent walk during a New England vacation, I saw a number of bird species congregating—certainly a sign that a long journey awaits them.

This time next year, visitors to both the John James Audubon Center at Mill Grove (Audubon, PA) and the Discovery Center (Philadelphia) will be able to experience migration in new ways. With support from generous donors, Audubon will install a MOTUS tower at Mill Grove, along with interactive kiosks that will link to Audubon's Migratory Bird Initiative's on-line tool. (A MOTUS tower picks up signals emitted by transmitters that have been placed on birds. The growing network of towers across North and South America allows us to track their hemispheric movements. These data help environmental groups like Audubon determine where to focus its work on behalf of birds.)

We are still seeking donations to bring interactive Migratory Bird Explorer kiosks to

the Discovery Center. There, we will use data from the MOTUS tower at the University of Pennsylvania to create lessons for students and enhance the public's understanding of how migratory birds are using Philadelphia's parks and other green spaces. Bird-Safe Baltimore Effort Underway

Bird-Safe Baltimore is a newly formed network of community partners whose mission is to ensure safe passage for birds, through education,

collision mitigation, and legislation. Following in the footsteps of other large city collaborations such as Lights Out Philly and Lights Out Harrisburg, Baltimore is joining this national movement to protect migratory birds. Bird-Safe Baltimore encourages businesses and residents across the city to turn off non-essential lights between 11 PM and 6 AM for four months each year (April, May, September, and October). People can also help birds by drawing blinds/curtains, using warm-colored amber or yellow bulbs, and utilizing timers and motion sensors when possible. Farewell to Jeanne Ortiz, Senior Program Manager, Landscape Conservation

Audubon Mid-Atlantic would like to take a moment to say thank you to Jeanne Ortiz, our Senior Program Manager of Landscape Conservation. Jeanne is moving on to a new role at Pennsylvania's Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) after nearly 14 years at

Audubon. Jeanne has led the 185-mile Kittatinny Ridge Conservation Landscape, a Global Important Bird Area, in partnership with the Pennsylvania DCNR, and has made it a model conservation effort for the commonwealth. She conducted "Return on Environment" studies with partners to document the economic value of natural system services and the economic impact of natural resources. The Carbon County study led to the creation of a \$10 million conservation fund that was approved by voters by a wide margin last November. This past spring, Penn Future recognized Jeanne for her role as a conservation leader in Pennsylvania. We will miss Jeanne and cannot wait to see all that she will accomplish on behalf of the environment in her new role at DCNR.

Wings Over Water: A Film Screening and Panel Discussion

Join Audubon Mid-Atlantic and partners on Wednesday, September 27th from 7:00 until 8:30pm at the Colonial Theater in Phoenixville, PA for a viewing of "Wings Over Water." This film shares the epic journey of three migratory birds and their connection to wetlands and other crucial waterways as they traverse thousands of miles to reach their nesting and breeding grounds. Two of the film's featured birds, Yellow Warblers and Mallard Ducks, also migrate through parts of the Atlantic Flyway, including the Delaware River Watershed where Audubon Mid-Atlantic is working to conserve, restore, and create quality habitat for these and many other bird species. Following the film, a panel of experts will discuss the annual phenomenon of migration and the inherent role of birds as indicators of


environmental health. <u>More information and an opportunity for discount</u> tickets is available on our website.



Opportunity for volunteers with the John James Audubon Center

Join Audubon Mid-Atlantic on September 30th from 9:00 until 3:00pm for a volunteer tree planting effort along the Perkiomen Creek, where we will enhance the tree canopy and riparian buffer damaged after Hurricane Ida. Riparian buffers, or stream-side areas of trees and other native vegetation, are essential areas of habitat for birds and other wildlife. They also play a critical role in protecting our drinking water quality and reducing damage from floods. Volunteers will learn to plant native trees and shrubs and help install fencing to protect the plantings from deer. Audubon will provide volunteers with gloves, tools and a free lunch. Meet the Author: Will McLean Greeley
