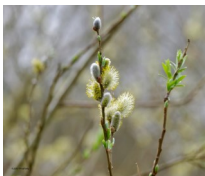

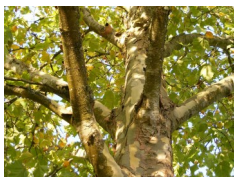


Smooth Azalea
(*Rhododendron arborescens*)

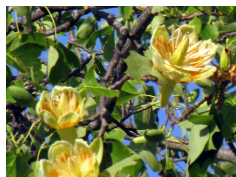


American Black Elderberry
(*Sambucus canadensis*)

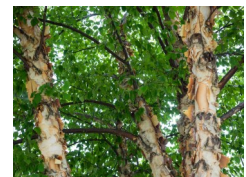
